
CS: I was posted overseas for a number of years, which opened my eyes to different cultures and ways of thinking. My work involved recruitment and also management of field assets. The work could be very demanding and diverse, and there was a lot of camaraderie. I find the dredging and marine construction industry to be very similar in that way. Each project is a new challenge, requiring fresh ideas.

WoW: What would you say is your biggest career milestone to date and why?

CS: Serving on the WEDA Board feels like a milestone to me. When I joined WEDA many years ago, I never imagined that I would have that opportunity. It's an organization that I care a lot about.

WoW: How would you say being a woman has affected your professional experience? What can we do to create more equal, uplifting spaces for women in your industry?

CS: Starting my career in a very male-dominated field meant figuring out a lot of things for myself. Now, much later, I realize all the little things people (men and women) did that helped me along the way. Being a mentor can really make a difference. If you have a chance to help someone you think has promise, regardless of their gender, give it a try. Mentoring can be as simple as writing a letter of recommendation or helping someone see their potential.



WoW: What do you see for the future of our group? **CS**: WoW is a great way to meet newcomers to WEDA and to catch up with friends. I'm interested in what women are working on in the dredging industry.
