#### NASA TRAM TOUR



- Tram tours take students behind the scenes at Johnson Space Center. They will have the opportunity to get an up close look at real working NASA facilities!
- The tram tour is first-come, first-served. Each tram seats 100 people and is wheelchair accessible.
- Tram tours take approximately 90 minutes to complete and depart every 20-60 minutes. (Check the tram schedule on the day of your visit)

### STARSHIP GALLERY \*\*Space Center Houston Must See\*\*

- Your journey through NASA history starts with the film On Human Destiny, a 15-minute documentary highlighting the great moments of the space program. After the film enter Starship Gallery to see actual spacecraft, touch a real moon rock, and walk through America's first space station, Skylab.
- Film shows every 30 minutes beginning at 10:30.
- Allow approximately 45 minutes for this attraction.

#### LIVING IN SPACE SHOW

- This live presentation demonstrates what daily life is like on the ISS. Students learn how astronauts work, sleep, eat, exercise and even go to the bathroom in space!
- Shows are every hour on the half-hour starting at 11:30.
- Allow approximately 25 minutes for this attraction.

- Experience the "feel" of a real shuttle launch! This multi-sensory experience dives you a hint of what a shuttle launch is truly like. Following, get briefed on the current happenings of the space program. These live briefings give up-to-date reports on the current Mars, Space Shuttle and Space Station missions.

# MANNED MANEUVERING UNIT TRAINER (MMU)
