The Disaster Relief Appropriations Act of 2013 (PL 113-2) allocated \$5.35 billion (\$5.08 billion after sequestration) to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to address areas impacted by Hurricane Sandy. The Corps' North Atlantic Division received \$4.56 billion (\$4.33 billion after sequestration) of this funding. Under the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, the North Atlantic Division will be executing projects under the following five categories.




